Differentiation

- Teachers can adapt the length and detail required in each activity to suit their learners.
- Teachers might scaffold learning by modelling the task first as an example.
- Teachers can provide students with information or website links.

Teaching and Learning Activities

The first official Paralympic Games were held in Rome in 1960.

Since then, many countries have hosted the Paralympic Summer and Winter Games.

Students are to create a timeline or a table outlining the years the Paralympic Summer and Winter Games have been held and in which cities/countries.

Their timeline/table could include the following data:

- Year hosted
- Location city and country
- Number of countries participating
- Number of athletes participating
- Number of sports included in the games
- Names of any new sports included in the games

The International Paralympic Committee has a list of the <u>Summer</u> and <u>Winter</u> Games.

Using an atlas, plot all the cities and countries that have hosted the Paralympic Summer and Winter Games on a blank map of the world.

Create a colour code (legend) for the Summer and Winter Games cities. Next to the city, add when the Games were held in that city.

In the student section of our website you can find a worksheet to help students complete this task if required. 3

Students are to create a brochure for people wishing to travel to one of the cities that will host an upcoming Paralympic Summer or Winter Games. It should highlight specific information about the Games and include some general information about the host city and country.

The brochure should contain the following information:

- Two interesting facts about the host city
- The population of the host country and city
- The dates of the Paralympic Games
- The sports that will be in the Paralympic Games
- Two interesting facts about the Paralympic Games in the host country
- The name of the main stadium that will host the opening and closing ceremonies
- Two activities or tourist sites someone could visit during their stay the host city

Don't forget to encourage students to include images to engage their audience, and if appropriate, reference the source of their information.







Develop a presentation to be delivered to the International Paralympic Committee persuading them to host the next Paralympic Games in your home city.

Your presentation could include:

- A persuasive letter
- A flyer or brochure
- A multimedia presentation

Extension research questions:

Who is Dr. Ludwig Guttmann? Why is he an important figure in the Paralympic movement?

When was the decision made for the Paralympics to be hosted by the same county hosting the Olympic Games for able-bodied athletes? Why was this decision made?

Identify six athletes who won gold medals in either the Paralympic Summer or Winter Games. List the sport and the event for which the medal was awarded.

Write 200 words describing the Paralympic Games in one of the host cities for the past three Games (can be either the Summer or Winter Games). Focus can be on key features such as:

- Topical issues of each Paralympic Games
- Media or other commentary about the host cities
- Australia's performance in the Games
